


Passover Place Cards



You'll need:

- Colored paper
- Pencil to trace
- Thin black marker
- Sharp scissors
- Glue

- 1. Use your pencil to trace the template on the coloured paper.
- 2. After tracing all shapes, cut each one with sharp scissors.
- **3.** Add a drop of glue on each piece and assemble to create the frog.
- 4. For the back, cut a rectangle, fold as shown and glue on to the back.






Pre-Seder Activities Tic Tac Toad

Instructions:


Cut out your frogs and matzahs.

Kadesh – Get your grape juice ready!

Did you know that grapes are one of 7 special fruits of Israel?

Today, Israel has more than 300 wineries. Approximately 60,000 tons of wine grapes are harvested in Israel annually - that's about 4.3 million bottles of wine!

In North America, Kedem is the most widely known kosher brand for grape juice. In Israel, the main grape juice is the Carmel Tirosh or 'Tirosh' produced by Carmel Winery.

Urchatz & Karpas -The Spring Herb Gets

Dipped Into Salty Water

It's time to get your green vegetable ready for some dipping into salty water!

Some Ashkenazi Jews use a potato for karpas, as green vegetables were not readily available in Eastern Europe.

If you enjoy salty water you'll love a trip to the Dead Sea!

The Dead Sea is one of the saltiest bodies of water on Earth – almost 10 times saltier than most oceans. The high salt concentration is what makes swimming in it feel like floating.

Sprawling more than 10km, the Malham cave at the southern tip of Israel's Dead Sea is the world's longest salt cave system.

Yachatz - Breaking the Matzah!

This is one of the most exciting parts of the seder - hiding the afikoman.

If you made an afikoman cover this year, make sure to give it the person leading the seder to keep the matzah safe and easy to find.

Avadim Hayinu – We Were Slaves in Egypt

Some Sephardic Jews mimic the lashings received by Jewish slaves by swatting their Seder table-mates with scallions.

Rachtza – Wash Those Hands Again!

Motzi Matzah – Time to Eat Some Matzah!

It's the moment we've been waiting for, that first bite of matzah! What type of matzah do you eat?

In North America many are accustomed to traditionally eat crunchy wheat-based matzah, or spelt or oat for those who have wheat sensitivities. This is the typical Ashkenazi tradition.

In some communities such as the Ethiopian community, the custom is to eat a soft, thicker version of matzah, similar to a flatbread. This "authentic" style of matza making is believed to be what matzah was like hundreds of years ago.

Some believe matzah became thinner and more cracker-like due to concerns that the bread wasn't entirely cooked within, and therefore not kosher for Passover. By the end of the 18th century hard matzah became the new-norm and is the most common version we see today.

Maror – Bitter Herb

Maror is not so pleasant to eat, but most people can't get enough of the tasty charoset, fruit and nut mixture, that it get's dipped into.

Charoset is enjoyed so much that the Ben and Jerry's factory in Be'er Tuvia in Israel makes Charoset flavoured ice cream each year!

Shulchan Aruch – The Meal

Some Sephardic Jews have a custom to continue eating some kitniyot foods on Passover such as rice, corn, sunflower seeds, and sesame seeds, in addition to legumes such as beans, peas, and lentils. This means they can have the popular Peanut Butter based Israeli snack 'Bamba'.

Feeding Bamba snacks to children may explain why the peanut allergy rate in Israel is 10 times lower compared to the rest of the Western world.

Since 1948, Israel has absorbed more immigrants per capita than any other country in the world.

One of the many unique communities in Israel are the Bene Israel, India's largest Jewish community. Today more than 80,000 live in Israel. The word for Passover in one of their native languages, Marathi, is "Anashi Dhakaicha San," which means "The Holiday of the Closing of the Anas."

In addition to the strong connection many have to Israel for religious or personal reasons, for decades it has been a safe haven for Jews in need all over the world.

What is Ladino? The Ladino language, also called Judeo-Spanish, Judesmo, or Sephardi, Romance language has been spoken by Sephardic Jews living mostly in Israel, the Balkans, North Africa, Greece, and Turkey. Ladino preserves many words and grammatical usages that have been lost in modern Spanish.

Today, Israel is the country hosting the most Ladino speakers, where approximately 200,000 still converse. Istanbul, Turkey, is also home to a prominent Ladino-speaking community and has been publishing a Ladino newspaper called El Amaneser (The Dawn) since 2005.
