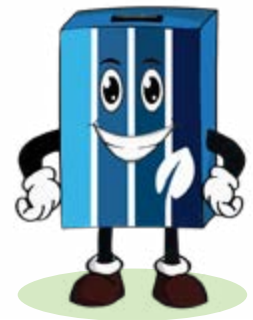


January - Tevet February - Shevat

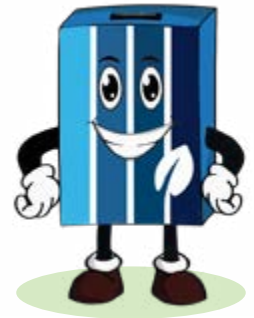


The JNF Blue Box
