

Poppy Anemone

- March is the start of the flower season in Israel. The country is home to over 8,000 species of flowers, and they start blooming in early spring. The national flower of Israel is the poppy anemone.
- The Jerusalem marathon takes place in the month of March.
- Purim a very exciting Jewish holiday, is considered one of the happiest and most observed in the country. Celebrate like a local and join in on lively dances, costumes, and sweets.
- April's mild temperatures means that more events are taking place outdoors and combined with the holiday of Passover - during which kids are out of school - this month is one of the best times to visit and experience Israel to the fullest.





Jewish Holidays:

The Talmud (ancient teachings about the Torah) tells us, "When the month of Adar arrives, we increase in joy" to welcome a season of miracles.

Purim: 14th day of Adar (March 23-24, 2024)

Purim is a Jewish holiday that celebrates the bravery of Queen Esther, the secretly Jewish wife of King Achashverosh of Persia. The story is recounted in the book of Esther and read in a special scroll called the Megillah.

Purim is often described as the Jewish springtime version of Halloween. Though Purim is much older than Halloween - the celebration dates to at least the first century BCE.

In the Diaspora, Purim celebrations take place in synagogues and Jewish Schools. In Israel, however, they last all day and spill out into the street with costume parades in the major cities.

The 14th day of Nissan (April 23-30, 2024)

Passover offers us the opportunity to learn in multiple ways and to think about some important Jewish values. The ideas of moving from slavery to freedom, welcoming the stranger because we were once strangers ourselves, and thinking about ways to pass on the story of our past to new generations - all are inherent in the celebration of this festival.

How do we pass on these important messages? Our Talmudic rabbis gave us a roadmap for how to best do it - the Passover Seder. We use the Haggadah (a special book) telling the story of the Israelites' Exodus from Egypt, and is filled with blessings, rituals and songs.
