

PRIME MATIONAL FUND JOINS PRIME MINISTER HARPER'S MISSION TO ISRAEL

Jewish National Fund of Canada and Karen Kaymeth L'Israel (KKL) were honoured to participate in the delegation that accompanied Prime Minister Harper on his mission to Israel. This was a once in a lifetime opportunity and it was evident that the experience had a profound impact on the delegates and the Prime Minister.

For many, the highlight was the Prime Minister's speech at the Knesset which was the first time that a Canadian Prime Minister had addressed Israel's parliament. When Prime Minister Harper said that Canada will stand by Israel "through fire and water", there was an eruption of applause and all of the Canadian delegates were beaming with pride. Before his speech, Prime Minister Harper was presented with a key to the Knesset, which was a first for a visiting world leader.

KKL hosted a dinner for the delegates and supporters with Prime Minister Stephen Harper, Mrs. Laureen Harper, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, and Mrs. Sara Netanyahu. Following the dinner, Prime Minister Harper surprised the guests and went on stage to perform a three-song set while everyone cheered and sang along.

A special moment for the JNF delegation was the cornerstone laying ceremony at the Hula Valley. Josh Cooper, CEO of JNF Canada and Efi Stenzler, World Chairman of KKL, both expressed their gratitude to the Prime Minister for accepting to serve as the 2013 Toronto Negev Dinner Honouree which raised the necessary funds to build the Stephen J. Harper Hula Valley Bird Sanctuary Visitor & Education Centre. It was also announced that the auditorium in the facility will be named in honour of Laureen Harper. The mission was a phenomenal experience for everyone and it was deeply gratifying to see the Prime Minister so delighted with the Hula Valley and his project.

ILENE-JO BELLAS, VANCOUVER This past year has been fulfilling for JNF Vancouver. We held a successful Negev Dinner in June honouring the IDF and its Heroes. Brigadier General Avigdor Kahalani, the hero of the 6 Day and Yom Kippur Wars, was moving and the evening ended with everyone singing and dancing with the IDF Chorus. This event was well attended and was one of the main highlights in my past two years as President. The Simchat Torah weekend with Gilad Schalit where over 850 people attended was also a monumental occasion in our community. I am very proud to be part of JNF Canada and to be able to see our supporters grow. Attending the Harper Dinner in Toronto was proof that there is support for Israel in Canada and the JNF has helped make it happen.



AARON BICKMAN, CALGARY Aaron was born and raised in Calgary, Alberta. Aaron's parents founded his love for Israel at an early age and this love was developed and nurtured through his education (he attended the Calgary Hebrew School/Calgary Jewish Academy from pre-school through junior high). KADESH BARNE'A SECURITY ROAD

KKL-JNF will construct a 900-meter perimeter road around the community of Kadesh Barne'a on Israel's western border with Egypt. The road will improve access to the area for security forces, local patrols, and residents. Within the area enclosed by the road, KKL-JNF is preparing 32 plots for the construction of homes for second-generation residents of the moshav.

Security roads are vitally important for isolated communities located in the periphery of Israel close to its borders. These roads provide safe access for residents and security for those living under the threat of attack.

OR YEHUDA GAN HATISH'A SPORTS CENTER

KKL-JNF is planning to develop an activity park together with the Or Yehuda Municipality at the edge of town. The park will focus on sports activity and will be open to the public. Development elements include, an entrance plaza and paths all accessible to strollers. Additional developments include shaded seating areas, picnic tables, landscaping, bicycle paths, lavatories, illuminated playing fields, a shaded playing area for youth and a grassy amphitheatre with a stage for community events.

By contributing to the development of the sports park in Or Yehuda you will be helping rehabilitate a neglected park and transforming it into part of the green urban environment in Or Yehuda, an underdeveloped city near Ben Gurion Airport.

LAKE KINNERET-BICYCLE PROMENADE

KKL-JNF and the Israel Government Tourist Corporation is developing a bicycle promenade from Kibbutz Ha'On around Lake Kinneret. The asphalt-paved path includes several entrance points along the way. The planned promenade is supported by a number of environmental organizations in order to offer a safe alternative to the busy highway around Lake Kinneret. The promenade will be wheelchair accessible.

By contributing to KKL-JNF's network of bicycle trails, you are helping open up a new world for nature loving cyclists. These trails provide fantastic opportunities to reach parts of the country not well known and give visitors an opportunity to see birds and other wildlife.

NETIV TEFAHOT HESDER YESHIVA – LANDSCAPE DEVELOPMENT

KKL-JNF will landscape the campus at Netiv Tefahot, a hesder yeshiva. The student body at the yeshiva, located on Moshav Tefahot in the Galilee, consists of young men from outlying areas throughout Israel, who, in addition to their Torah studies and army service, also volunteer in community service. Several have married and made their home in the Galilee after graduation. After more than a decade of using temporary structures, permanent buildings are being planned for this large learning community. KKL-JNF will do its part to support the important work here by landscaping 0.25 hectares (625) acres at the new campus. Development will include landscaping and irrigation, paving paths, constructing retaining walls, a rockery, a scenic lookout and the installation of fencing and railings.



Hundreds of volunteers came together across the country in support of JNF Canada's 2014 Tu Bi'Shevat telethon to grow Adamit Park in Israel, located along the Lebanese border. Funds raised will be used to plant mature Kermes Oak, Israeli Pistachio and Judah trees across approximately 100 dunams (25 acres) of land, as well as replant 600 natural coppice trees. Part of the project also includes transporting water to irrigate the newly planted trees from the nearby KKL-JNF Adamit Reservoir.

After years of being held hostage by Hamas at an unknown location in the Gaza strip, Gilad Schalit was set free on October 18th, 2011. The world witnessed history as they watched Gilad return home to his family. In September 2013, JNF Canada was excited to host Gilad Schalit on a tour to Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, Calgary & Vancouver. Over 7,000 guests attended the events to stand in solidarity with Israel and to say "welcome home". On August 11, 2013, the Jewish National Fund, Manitoba/Saskatchewan Branch held the first annual Breakfast for Israel. Breakfast for Israel was created as a way to keep supporters engaged throughout the summer and to bring the JNF to them, as many supporters head to the lake when the mercury reaches the high 20s and 30s.

"Part of working for the Jewish National Fund allows us to flex our 'think outside the box' muscles in order to come up with new ways to fundraise," says Rob Berkowits, Executive Director of the JNF Manitoba/Saskatchewan Region, "It was doing this that helped us come up with the idea to bring 'Breakfast for Israel' to Lake Winnipeg cottage country."

Last year's event supported the restoration of the outdoor space at Ilanot Special Education School, the same project that proceeds from the Negev Gala were directed to. Ilanot Special Education School is a public special needs school located in Jerusalem that serves students between the ages of six and twenty-one. These children all have severe motor and cognitive disabilities. Currently, the outdoor space on the grounds is in such a state of disrepair that it is unsafe and unusable. Pledges from the event will contribute to the restoration of the the outdoor space that will be designed to meet the students' physical, social and emotional needs.

This year, Breakfast for Israel will be held at the same venue, Lakeview Resort Gimli on August 10, 2014. A project for this year's event has not yet been chosen but is sure to support one of the many deserving KKL-JNF projects in Israel.



2014 NEGEV DINNER HONOUREE ACCOUNTS FOR ITS COMMUNITY SERVICE

On June 11, hundreds of people will gather at Montreal's prestigious Windsor Station, and join JNF in honouring the prominent financial services firm, Richter, at the 2014 Negev Dinner.

The Ilanot School serves the needs of Arab, Jewish and Bedouin Israeli children living with severe learning disabilities, as well as motor and cognitive impairment, and requires major infrastructural improvements. This adapted schoolyard will finally offer these students a proper environment that is suited to their specific physical, social and emotional needs.

As an adult, I have been actively involved in numerous capacities for the Jewish community. Some of my past and current involvements include: Co-Chair of Camp Kadimah; Regional Chair of the United Israel Appeal campaign; Founding Board Member of the Canadian Centre for Israel and Jewish Affairs (CIJA), acting as the representative from Atlantic Canada; Board Member, representing Atlantic
