Rama Ben Zvi and her husband have lived in Nataf for 25 years and opened Rama's Kitchen 21 years ago. The restaurant, overlooking the magnificent landscape of the Judean hills, is a renowned country-style establishment known for its changing menu of seasonal dishes. The restaurant was hosting a wedding party when the fire broke out.

"The winds were so strong, eastern winds, and they just don't stop," she said. "The fire changed direction and started coming close to the restaurant. I saw a big tongue of fire coming toward the restaurant and I understood that was the end of Rama's Kitchen." The restaurant was destroyed in just 10 minutes.

Some of the restaurant's Palestinian workers and several neighbors somehow saved Rama's house located nearby. "They saved my house," she says. "I don't know what they did, but the fire didn't touch the house. Trees near the house were burned, but the house wasn't touched."

KKL – JNF is dedicated to rehabilitating the forests that surround Rama's Kitchen in Nataf. The next phases of the rehabilitation process will include: a survey about the extent of the damage caused by the fire, cutting and removing damaged trees, replanting wherever it is needed, and thinning new young pine trees, to allow different natural vegetation to grow.



LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

JNF University (JNFU) is proud to have completed another successful year of programming. During our second year, we have brought programs to campus that are educational, fun and showcase Israel's achievements in a positive light. We have established a strong partnership with organizations such as Hillel Ontario and together we have been able to reach students in new ways.

Students who have been part of the JNFU Leadership Development Program participated in webinars that featured speakers from Brothers for Life, the Ethiopian Jewish community and AICAT just to name a few. JNFU Students were paired with young professionals who are in their field of study. These young professionals served as mentors for the students and will continue to be available to them throughout the 2016-2017 academic year.

Across Ontario, JNFU and Hillel Ontario created a new and innovative way of teaching university students the meaning of Tu Bi'Shevat. Together we developed a terrarium building workshop where each layer of the terrarium represented another part of the Tu Bi'Shevat Seder.

JNFU also expanded its reach by leading the Ivey Business School's Israel trip in February. Students on the mission were part of a case study that benefited our stakeholders in the Arava.

We are proud to be organizing a second JNF University Mission set to leave this spring. As in its inaugural year, the JNFU Mission will take place over Yom Ha'atzmaut. This trip is meant to showcase true Zionism and the modern day contributions of JNF.

NOAM GERSHONY A MODERN A MODERN ISRAELI HERO

In March, JNF University brought Paralympic Gold Medalist, Noam Gershony on a speaking tour to 10 Canadian universities. This tour is the first of its kind for JNFU. Noam's story was an inspiration to Jewish and non-Jewish students. Over a span of 10 days, Noam covered many university campuses in Ontario and Quebec. Noam's story began in 2006, during the breakout of the Second Lebanon War, when his helicopter was in a serious accident that left him critically injured and unfortunately his co-pilot did not survive. After breaking the majority of his bones in the accident, the road to recovery was long and challenging, but his spirit helped him overcome all odds and he is now able to walk again. Through Beit Halochem Tel Aviv, Noam discovered his passion for tennis and went on to play competitively. After four short years, Noam's ranking quickly rose to number two in the world of wheelchair tennis. In 2012, Noam won the gold medal at the London Paralympic Games beating the number one seed.



Deemed a modern Israeli hero, Noam's non-political message of courage is a phenomenal example of what students at Canadian universities need today. Noam demonstrates the Israeli spirit to overcome any challenges we may face and to make the most of what we are given. This tour could not have been possible without the support of Hillel and our sponsors. We thank Noam for his incredible work, inspirational words of wisdom and hope to see him again soon!

YOSSI has lived in Kfar Aza for 43 years ... "The threat of being targeted has significantly decreased since the plantings. Just the fact that we know that we cannot be seen, due to the presence of the trees, gives us a feeling of security. In the past, we could be observed through binoculars from not far away; our movement around the kibbutz could be tracked. Because of the trees, we are no longer spied on right into our living rooms at any given time, and we are safe and saved from being shot."

ORIT, Community Director of Kfar Aza, has lived in the kibbutz for 37 years ... In response to the hostility from our neighbors, we have had no recourse but to build fences and more recently, plant security trees. It's sad, but we have no choice; we want to live. For us, the trees are lifesavers. We are glad, at least, that the barrier is

Funds from this year's Negev Dinner will be used to renovate the infrastructure of the Israeli Scouts facilities in the city of Raanana. These renovations will make the Israeli Scouts' facilities more accessible for children and youth with disabilities.

The Israeli Scouts run programing for youth aged 9-21 throughout Israel. They bring together children and youth from across the spectrum of Israeli society, regardless of political, religious, or ethnic background. In addition, the Israeli Scouts promote the inclusion of children and youth with disabilities. Through the Israeli Scouts programs, children and youth in Israel are working side by side, learning leadership skills, the value of inclusive community and are developing an enhanced sense of self-image.

The Israeli Scouts have over 80,000 members throughout Israel which includes over 2,500 children and youth with disabilities. Scouts with disabilities are included in activities held within the local clubs. These activities include attending camps, field trips and being a part of delegations which travel abroad. The Israeli Scouts also have specialized groups that bring together youth with the same disabilities and online activities are made available for those with significant mobility restrictions.

Outdoor elements will include the installation of four new tennis courts, a soccer pitch, a playground, landscaping and walkways. This outdoor project will be named after the honouree, Mr. Al Osten and will be known as The Al Osten Athletic Facility.

What makes the Calgary project so vital and relevant is that programs at the tennis centers are beyond sports,

educating, enriching and mentoring youth to maximize their success in life. These programs serve children, teens and young adults in the rapidly expanding and economically-challenged Negev area, and extend the work of the Israel Tennis Center in Beer Sheva. The goal of this project is to double the number of at risk children served by the centre including: children from low income households, new immigrants, Ethiopians, Bedouins, and Arabs. The ITC offers superb programming focusing on co-existence between Israel's Jewish and Arab populations and integrating new comers as well as the physically and developmentally disabled. The ITC's programs engage youth at the margins of society and provide them with meaningful programs, recreation, physical education and sportsmanship. No child is turned away due to a lack of financial resources.

Rabbi Green has served as Senior Rabbi of Shaarey Zedek Congregation since the fall of 2000. In 1990 he married his wife Chaya and they live in Winnipeg with her triplets Daniel, Eve and Shoshanah.

Rabbi Green is a passionate supporter and advocate of the State of Israel; he has always made himself available to help the Jewish National Fund (and other Israeli based organizations in Winnipeg); during the last 16 years he has been the one making the High Holidays Appeal on behalf of JNF at Shaarey Zedek Congregation.

In the spirit of building bridges to local communities, JNF Montreal, in partnership with the Portuguese Association of Canada, honoured the memory of Aristides de Sousa Mendes, a Portuguese diplomat who attained "righteous gentile" status after saving the lives of 30,000 people (nearly 10,000 Jews) during the Second World War.

As a result of his heroic actions, Sousa Mendes was stripped of his diplomatic position, forbidden from making a

living and his children were barred from universities and employment opportunities.

A large and diverse crowd was privileged to watch a presentation given by Aristides' grandson, Louis-Philippe de Sousa Mendes, who provided intriguing details about his grandfather's saga. Ms. Andrée Lotey recounted her fascinating personal tale of self-discovery. Born and raised in Quebec, Ms. Lotey had, in recent years, learned that her late father concealed the fact that his life was saved by Aristides de Sousa Mendes during the war.

Deep appreciation is owed to Speaker's Board Chair, Judi Fish, for her passion and perseverance in championing this sold out evening, which was covered by several media outlets, even in Portuguese! Many thanks to the Consuls General of Portugal and Monaco for their attendance.

JOHN BAIRD PARK

The park will serve the neighborhood's children and families and will include a variety of fitness and playground equipment, among other essential and enhancing elements, not least, bomb shelters. The park, as well as the leisure and recreation opportunities it offers, are essential for enhancing the quality of life for Sderot's citizens.



KOLLEL STUDENT VILLAGE

JNF Canada is partnering in the establishment of a kollel in the southern community of Naveh, where students will learn Torah while pursuing academic studies at the same time. The project includes the construction of a beit midrash and classrooms. Your donation will be used to establish a multipurpose building that will serve the students of the Naveh Kollel and their families. The facility will serve to strengthen not only Naveh, but the whole of Halutza and the Western Negev.



WOMEN'S SHELTER IN RISHON LE ZION

JNF Canada is working with "NO to Violence Against Women" to build a shelter for women and children fleeing domestic abuse. Established in 1978 by Israel Prize Laureate Ruth Rasnic, "NO to Violence Against Women" has been helping victims of domestic violence by providing emergency housing, running a 24 hour helpline and advocating for the rights of women. A shelter houses 10-12 families at a time and provides victims of domestic violence with a safe environment where they can start over. Staff and volunteers work with the families to access therapy, secure income, and find new housing.

TEDDY PARK

JNF Canada takes great pleasure to partner once again with the Jerusalem Foundation in the Teddy Park Project. This a magnificent undertaking in honour of Teddy Kollek, the much loved Mayor of Jerusalem. The park includes a multitude of fascinating elements to attract visitors. JNF Canada will bring new life to an historic building and adopt two of the most prestigious gates, surrounding the Park. This historic building, central to the park, represents a very significant period in "modern" Jerusalem's history as it was built in one of the first neighborhoods outside the old city walls.



The soup kitchen understands the great importance of helping needy families, some of which come to their location and some whom receive meals delivered to their homes. The structure that houses the dining room and kitchen is 30 years old. Walls need to be added, the kitchen needs to be reorganized, painting is required, as well as significant plumbing work. These renovations will create a pleasant and welcoming ambience for those who come to eat at the dining room.

ETHIOPIAN ELDERS' CENTRE IN KIRYAT GAT

Atachlit is a working farm and heritage centre for Ethiopian culture in southern Israel. With the establishment of the Atachlit Farm, life has changed for the Ethiopian elders living in the vicinity. There is now a demand for their agricultural and craft knowledge and the younger generation has gained a new sense of respect for their elders. This project involves the construction of a social club – a meeting place for the Ethiopian elders to gather together to socialize, engage with one another and share their memories and stories.
