Pre-1948: Planting the Seeds Together

The predecessor organization to JNF Canada emerged to connect Diaspora Jews with their ancestral homeland, driven by Theodore Herzl's vision. Together, global Jewish communities, including Canada, fundraised to transform barren lands into thriving forests and fields in Israel. This became a refuge for Jewish immigrants fleeing persecution in Eastern Europe.

Medical & Scientific Research

01. Discovery of the Aharonov-Bohm effect

A fundamental principle behind the interaction of an electron wave with electromagnetic fields.

02. Azilect (rasagiline)

A medication used for the treatment of Parkinson's disease.

03. BioProtect

A bioabsorbable radiation shield that protects healthy tissues during radiation therapy.

04. BrainGate

Creates and tests devices that allow people with spinal cord injury, brainstem stroke, and ALS to control a computer cursor simply by thinking about the movement of their own paralyzed hand and arm.

05. Brain Network Analytics technology

An objective assessment of cognition (brain function) to help manage mental illnesses and cognitive disorders.

06. Copalia (amlodipine + valsartan)

A combination medication used for the treatment of hypertension.

07. Copaxone (glatiramer acetate)

A widely used medication for the treatment of multiple sclerosis.





08. CoreBone

A natural alternative to current synthetic, bovine, and human derived bone grafts.

09. Doxil (liposomal doxorubicin)

A chemotherapy medication used for treating various types of cancer, including ovarian and breast cancer. It utilizes liposome technology pioneered by Hebrew University researchers.

10. EarlySense

A contact-free monitoring systems for detecting early signs of patient deterioration for hospitals and healthcare settings.

11. Emergency Bandage

Also known as the Israeli bandage, this specially designed, first-aid device is used to stop bleeding from hemorrhagic wounds caused by traumatic injuries in pre-hospital emergency situations.

12. ENvue

A feeding tube placement system with advanced methods of navigation for accurate enteral tube placement.

13. Exelon (rivastigmine)

A medical drug that's used for the treatment of mild to moderate dementia associated with Alzheimer's disease or Parkinson's disease.

14. Flexible Stent

Also known as the NIR Stent or EluNIR.

15. Guide In Medical

A new groundbreaking non-invasive guided intubation device.









16. IceCure Medical

A minimally invasive cryoablation technology that destroys tumors by freezing as an alternative to surgical tumor removal.

17. Insightec Technology

A non-invasive focused ultrasound technology for precise surgical procedures with no incisions, and little to no risk of infection.

18. IsraAID

An Israeli organization whose mission is to support people affected by humanitarian crisis. From earthquakes and hurricanes to epidemics and forced displacement, IsraAID has been at the forefront of responding to major humanitarian crises worldwide.

19. Nanose Medical

A non-invasive and affordable breathalyzer test for screening, diagnosing, and monitoring a variety of disease and medical conditions.

20. Opsumit (macitentan)

A medication used for the treatment of pulmonary arterial hypertension.

21. PerfAction Technologies

An advanced drug delivery systems for precise medication dosing.

22. PillCam

A small camera capsule that can be swallowed and captures images of the digestive tract, aiding in medical diagnosis.

23. ReWalk

A groundbreaking exoskeleton that enables individuals with spinal cord injuries to walk again.

24. Sambucol

An over-the-counter elderberry-based anti-influenza syrup.

25. Sensipar (cinacalcet)

A medication used for the treatment of hyperparathyroidism and hypercalcemia in patients with parathyroid carcinoma.

26. SightDx

A portable system for detecting malaria and other blood-related diseases.

27. SniffPhone

A compact handheld device that measures exhaled breath for early diagnosis of cancer.

28. SpineAssist

The first commercially available mechanical guidance system for spine surgery.

29. Talzenna (talazoparib)

A PARP inhibitor used for the treatment of certain types of breast cancer.

30. Telesofia Medical

A patient engagement platform intended to improve clinical outcomes using personalized educational videos.

31. Treanda (bendamustine)

A chemotherapy medication used for the treatment of chronic lymphocytic leukemia and non-Hodgkin's lymphoma.

Arts & Culture

32. Krav Maga

An Israeli martial art derived from a combination of techniques used in aikido, judo, karate, boxing, and wrestling and known for its focus on real-world situations and its extreme efficiency.

33. Netta Barzilai

An Israeli singer-songwriter who won the 2018 Eurovision Song Contest for Israel. Her winning song "Toy" went on to top charts across Europe, the UK and the US.

34. Shmuel Yosef Agnon

An Israeli novelist, poet, and short-story writer known for his characteristic narratives of life of the Jewish people. He won the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1966.

Agriculture & Water Management

35. BioBee

Produces and implements beneficial macro-organisms in agriculture for natural pollination and biological pest control.

36. Desalination

A groundbreaking desalination process commercialized by IDE Technologies, that froze water to separate the salt, then melted the ice. Over time, other methods like reverse osmosis became more commonly used in IDE's plants and others across the world. IDE has supplied commercial water treatment plants not only to Israel and the U.S., but to 40 countries.

37. GFA (Grow Fish Anywhere) Advanced Systems

The most efficient fish growing system with no pollution where fish can be raised on land anywhere in the world, without having to exchange water or treat it chemically.

38. Netafim

Modern drip irrigation techniques, conserving water resources and revolutionizing agricultural practices worldwide.

39. Reforestation

Israel is one of only two countries in the world that began the 21st century with more trees than it had in the previous century. Since it was established in 1901, the JNF has planted more than 240 million trees all over the country.

40. Soil Solarization

A method of pest control that involves heating the soil by solar radiation.

41. Steakholder Foods

Using advanced biology and proprietary 3D bioprinting technology, they are developing real meat, from ethically harvested cells, that are delicious, nutritious, safe, and consistent.

42. Tomaccio Cherry Tomatoes

A smaller and sweeter variety of shelf-stable tomatoes, which has become a staple in kitchens worldwide.

43. Water Recycling

Israel is the #1 country in the water for water recycling and recycles more than 75% of its wastewater and sewage.

44. Watergen

Creates high quality drinking water out of air for people everywhere.

Renewable Energy

45. 3G Solar

Developed the first commercial-size solar energy system that uses coloured dyes rather than the more expensive silicon and can also function in sunless conditions.

46. AORA's Solar-Power Generation Solution

The world's first gas turbine solar thermal power station that allows uninterrupted, green power 24 hours a day to grid-based and off-grid locations.

47. Dud Shemesh

Solar water heater comprising a solar panel and a hot water tank.

48. Leviathan Energy's Wind Tulip

A cost-effective, silent, vibration-free wind turbine designed as an aesthetic environmental sculpture, producing clean energy at high efficiency from any direction.

49. Pythagoras Solar's Photovoltaic Glass Units

The world's first solar windows.

50. SolarEdge

Solar power optimization technology















Technology & Innovation

51. Babylon

A single-click computer translation, dictionary and information source utility program.

52. Car Phone

World's first car phone was invented at the Motorola headquarters in Tel Aviv.

53. Comverse

The first voicemail system that combined voice, fax, and calling functions into a single system.

54. Disk on Key

The world's first USB drive.

55. DNA computing machine system

World's smallest and uses its input DNA molecule as its sole source of energy.

56. Drones

The first fixed and rotary-wing unmanned aircraft was invented in Israel which paved the way for more advanced drone technology.

57. FaceID

Apple's facial recognition software is based on technology created by Israeli companies PrimeSense and RealFace.

58. Firewall

The software that protects our data from dangerous cyber activity.

59. Fiverr

The world's largest freelance services marketplace.

60. ICQ

The first global instant messaging software.

61. Iron Dome

A highly advanced missile defense system that detects and intercepts incoming rockets, protecting civilians from harm.

62. Intel 8088

Microprocessor developed by Intel's Israeli team in Haifa that powered the first PC built by IBM and kickstarted the PC revolution. Almost all the world's PCs are built around CPUs that can claim the 8088 as an ancestor.

63. Laser Keyboard

Virtual keyboard projected onto a wall or table.

64. Medigus

World's smallest video camera – a camera with a 0.99 mm (0.039 in) diameter, designed to fit in a tiny endoscope but is also used by NASA for their unmanned spaceship repair robots.

65. MobileEye

A single, inexpensive sensor, the camera, that revolutionized driver-assist and is used in over 100 million vehicles.

66. Nanowire

A conductive wire made of a string of tiny particles of silver, a thousand times thinner than a human hair.

67. OrCam MyEye

A portable, artificial vision device that allows the visually impaired to understand text and identify objects through audio feedback.

68. Quicktionary Electronic Dictionary

A pen-sized scanner that can scan words or phrases and immediately translate them into other languages.

69. Smartphone dual lens technology

Telephoto lens design, optical zoom, and a method for intelligently fusing images from the wide-angle and telephoto lenses to improve image quality.

70. TDMoIP

In telecommunications, the emulatio of time-division multiplexing over a packet-switched network.

71. Thunderbolt

A widely used interface technology that connects external peripherals to a computer.

72. TransChip

Made taking pictures with cell phones possible by developing the first high-resolution camera to fit on a single electronic chip for use in cell phones.

73. USB flash drive

A flash memory data storage device integrated with a USB interface.

74. Voice Over Networks

The technology that enabled the creation of VoIP (Voice over Internet Protocol).

75. Waze

Provides real-time traffic information to more than 150 million users.

Get to Know Our Impact

Did you know... every year, we start or complete between 10-20 unique projects in eight main Areas of Impact. In this section, hear from some of our active and recently completed projects and the impact they have for communities across Israel.

The Hadar School for Special Needs Students in Sderot





1. Community Development projects build up public spaces like parks & playgrounds, community centers and security shelter which provide services, after-school care, recreational activities, business training for women, mental health support, and security.



2. Education is key to breaking cycles of poverty and is a critical long-term investment towards stronger communities. We fundraise for expanding schools to accommodate increasing demand: after-school spaces for tutoring and support, and rooms in museums & exhibits.



3. Environment projects include forestry efforts like planting or rehabilitating forests, responding to wildfires, and outdoor education like nature camps for students. We've also laid thousands of kms of cycling trails and other recreational infrastructure to promote outdoor activities.



4. Healthcare is especially hard to access for periphery communities who are far from major cities. We fund life-saving healthcare facilities that provide services like: heart surgery for children, trauma & PTSD therapy, cancer treatment, and drug and addiction recovery.



5. Senior Support for our aging population is often forgotten and underfunded. We believe Israel's elderly deserve to live their golden years with dignity and care. This includes expanding facilities at senior care centres.





7. Sport, Arts & Music help children and adults discover their talents and reach their potential. These activities are often paired with therapy, education, or community development to create culturally vibrant and diverse communities.

8. Youth at Risk in underserved communities have a higher chance of ending up in dangerous or criminal activities. Facilities that offer extra support, attention, mentors and structure can stop recurring cycles of poverty and redirect kids to education, meaningful employment and healthier, happier.

Tennis & Education Centre for Sderot and Gaza Envelope

Israeli Tennis and Education Centres teach children so much more than just tennis. ITEC runs many programs, with diverse focuses like integrating children from diverse backgrounds (religious, ethnic, socio-economic), empowerment programs for girls, welcoming newcomers, special needs classes, and more. Tennis brings the children to the centre and the education programs offered ensure that they have a bright future ahead.

School for Children with Special Needs

.

The Hadar School provides education and care for children with special needs in the Gaza area. The school welcomes children with autism and other physical and cognitive disabilities. It also relieves the burden on parents as primary caregivers, so they can maintain a regular income, and support other family members. The Hadar School operates 5 days a week, serves 3 meals a day and provides before and after-school care. It currently can accommodate 38 students but with JNF Canada's funding, the current renovation will more than double the Hadar school's capacity, to serve more than 80 students.

Sheltered Education Room

During times of escalation, schools are often forced to close. This interrupts crucial childhood development, stops regular social interaction, and leaves children and parents isolated at home (sometimes for days). An attack-proof education room allows them to remain active and engaged during a school shutdown. Therapeutic Horse Farm for Children with Special Needs

Founded by four mothers of adults with special needs, the Carmel Therapeutic Horse Farm in Meir Shfeya Youth Village near Haifa will serve hundreds of children and youth who face emotional problems, anxiety, social difficulties, and PTSD. Therapeutic riding is a widely successful form of therapy, particularly for children. The horse farm will also employ adults with special needs. Funds raised by JNF will go towards the building of the overall farm, stables, and covered areas to ride in all weather conditions.

Dental Clinic for Patients with Special Needs

JNF Canada is proud to have taken the lead in renovating this dental clinic in order to meet the special needs of patients. A disproportionately high number of people in this population suffer from chronic dental disease, severe gum problems, and increased pain and suffering. In many cases, they resist going to the dentist altogether and never get treatment. The "Peh Bari" (meaning "Healthy Mouth") Dental Clinic provides specially trained staff, personal treatment plans, and calming techniques to help relieve anxieties in the patients it proudly serves. The clinic serves around 220 special needs patients annually.

Planned Giving

For many Canadians, the biggest tax bill of your life may be in the year of death. That's because on the date of death, you are deemed to dispose of all your capital property at fair market value, which could give rise to capital gains tax. Such assets include your real estate (other than your principal residence, which will be taxfree), as well as any financial assets you own, such as stocks, bonds, or other securities.

In addition, if you die with a Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP) or Registered Retirement Income Fund (RRIF), the entire fair market value will be included in your income for your final year (absent a qualifying rollover to a spouse, partner or qualifying dependent). For example, if you're an Ontario or British Columbia resident, that means your RRSP or RRIF could be taxed at rates approaching 53.5%, depending on the amount of income in the year of death and the fair market value or your plan.

Fortunately, if you have a philanthropic intent, strategic planned giving can potentially eliminate the tax payable on the deemed disposition of your non-registered assets that go to charity, as well as on gifts of your RRSP or RRIF.

For non-registered accounts, if you have appreciated securities, consider gifting those to charity upon death. Not only will your estate get a donation receipt for the fair market value of those securities, under a special tax rule for "in-kind" donations of appreciated securities, there won't be any capital gains tax owing on the gifted shares.

You may also consider gifting some (or all) of your RRSP to RRIF to charity. While the FMV of your RRSP or RRIF will be taxable in the year of death, you will get an offsetting donation receipt for the same amount allowing you to potentially eliminate the entire tax associated with the deemed income inclusion of your RRSP or RRIF.

As with all planned giving, be sure to consult with your tax advisor and lawyer to ensure the above strategies make sense in the context of your entire estate plan.

Plan now to save taxes later

Let's consider David, who owns \$100,000 of bank stock which he bought decades ago for \$40,000. He also had \$250,000 remaining in his RRIF. Without any planning, his tax bill for the year of death would be approximately \$15,000 of capital gains tax on the bank stock and up to \$134,000 of tax on the RRIF, depending on his other income in the year of death.

If David decides to leave the \$100,000 bank stock to charity in his will, he will save the \$15,000 in capital gains tax upon death, and get a donation receipt for \$100,000 which can save him approximately \$50,000 in tax when applied against the tax owing on the RRIF.

The charity gets \$100,000 and the estate has saved \$65,000 in tax.

Israel Festival and Gala



In Oct 2022, at the first annual Climate Solutions Prize Festival & Awards Gala, JNF Canada awarded over \$1 million USD to 3 breakthrough research solutions in Israel. These solutions were evaluated to have significant potential, in their respective fields, to address our climate crisis and provide promising, scalable solutions.



Israel Breakthrough Research Prize Winners



Avner Rothschild | Technion Institute of Technology

Green Hydrogen Production at Scale

About 95% of all hydrogen is produced from natural gas, a fossil fuel. As a result, global hydrogen production is responsible for emitting around 830 million tonnes of CO2 per year (equivalent to the total emissions for the UK and Indonesia combined). Professor Avner Rothschild's team has developed a way to produce "green hydrogen" - a process that uses renewable power such as solar or wind to create hydrogen that emits no CO2. This solution means that green hydrogen could scale up to supply almost 25% of the world's hydrogen by 2050.



Dr. Malachi Noked | Bar Ilan University

Sodium Ion Batteries

Renewable energy sources such as wind and solar are strong enough to power our planet, but the barrier lies in how to store this energy long-term, so it can be used at a steady pace. Dr. Noked's development of sodium ion batteries offers a more environmentally friendly storage system for large-scale global use.



Itzhak Mizrahi | Ben Gurion University

Methane reduction in cows

It's well-known that cows produce a lot of methane, a gas that is 28 times stronger than CO2. Professor Mizrahi and team have been studying cow microbiome for over 11 years, on a platform they developed uniquely for this research. Using modeling, genomics, metabolomics and other fields of research, they are on track to validate a scalable and long-term solution to reducing methane emissions from cows, and revolutionize animal agriculture.







A Win for the Planet, for the Ecosystem, and for JNF Canada!

The first Quebec Climate Solutions Festival (May 23-24) was an incredible success! With over 800 participants, the festival brought together hundreds of innovators, investors, startups, academics, government officials and renowned speakers including Stephen Bronfman, Dax Dasilva, Danièle Henkel, Frédéric Lalonde and many more at the Grand Quai du Port de Montréal. The Quebec CSP awarded over \$290,000 in prizes to Quebec's best and brightest innovators.

Quebec Breakthrough Research Prize Winners



1st Place: Philip Raphals & Prof. Charles Kiyanda Concordia University

Solution: NovoPower Waste Heat Systems recycles heat waste (high amounts of heat expelled into the atmosphere) from data centres (where cloud data is stored) into electricity that in turn powers the data centre itself or nearby heating systems. This circular system reduces the need for heating and cooling, water use and greenhouse gas emissions.



2nd Place: Dr. Soodeh Abedini & Dr. Maria Elektorowicz Concordia University

Solution: The team has developed a device that fits into the ventilation system of cattle barns. Strong gases from the cows travel into the exhaust system, and are converted into electricity, and stored. The cells are then used as a power source for the facility in closed loop of perpetually renewable energy. This technology can be scaled to wastewater treatment facilities, landfills and refineries and countless other emissions-heavy industries.

The 2nd edition of the Climate Solutions Festival will bring together global attendees and leading Israelis for inspiring conferences, panel discussions, workshops, and roundtables. The Climate Solutions Tour brings global leaders to connect with their Israeli counterparts and get exposed to the power of the Startup Nation.

Year in Review

Here is a recap of all we have achieved this year:

• In December 2022, over 500 students took part in our Hanukkah/Winter Camps. JNF took a unique approach in presenting Hanukkah to Jewish day schools and campers by incorporating education about olive trees and Israeli forests.

• Over 5000 students took part in Tu Bi'Shevat programming.

• In January 2023, JNF Canada hosted a virtual Hackathon with the theme Accessibility in Nature. 150 students participated in this competition-style event that brought together students and mentors from Israel and Canada to collaborate on innovative projects focused on addressing accessibility in nature.

• Over 500 students and educators, took part in celebrating the "Yoms." As part of our educational initiatives, we conducted workshops to celebrate - Yom Ha'atzmaut (Israel Independence Day) and Yom Yerushalayim (Jerusalem Day) at day schools, Hebrew schools, and Sunday schools in Hamilton and the Greater Toronto Area.

• We worked with 30 Jewish Day schools across Canada; from elementary to high school.

• In addition, we worked with over 40 Hebrew and Sunday schools. Our activities were adaptable to different objectives and time constraints, catering to students of all ages.
